Research Interests

I am interested in the politics of service delivery and public goods provision in developing countries. My projects explore the politics between actors who engage in service provision, the governance structures that shape these interactions and the specific challenges of creating and maintaining water, sanitation, and energy services, particularly in rural areas. My work has examined the impact NGOs on the relationships between rural communities and local government in the Peruvian Amazon. Building on this work, I have explored interactions between NGOs and local governments in Peru and Bolivia, focusing on how different policies of decentralization shape these local relationships. Much of my research focuses on the challenges of drinking water services, including the burdens on rural communities to manage water infrastructure and the ways that decentralization reforms have resolved some issues while reifying inequities. Recently, I have expanded this work on water and service provision to study public health, particularly in the context of the COVID-19 pandemic and the ramifications of climate change on rural communities and their access to water.

Teaching Interests

I am interested in expanding students' awareness of the drivers and consequences of poverty within and across countries and developing a sense of efficacy in students to engage in policy and efforts to address inequality and poverty. I have developed five courses at UNM: The Politics of Poverty and Inequality, which analyzes the causes and consequences of these issues at local levels, The Politics of Development, which explores competing theories about variation in human and economic development across countries, The Politics of Water in Latin America, which focuses on economic and political development through the lens of water, The Politics of Making a Difference, which assesses the factors that make individual and group efforts successful in social change, Comparative Political Economy of Development, and a graduate course that reviews foundational scholarly work on distributive politics and development.

Service Interests

My interests in service at UNM and in the political science discipline is to foster interdisciplinary connections that facilitate engagement in communities to solve problems and provide opportunities for students' professional development. I have focused my attention on contributing to the development of a network of researchers interested in water, supporting efforts at UNM to internationalize the university, and investing in the political science department. I have co-organized the 2018 Greenleaf Symposium on Rural Transformation in Latin America's Changing Climate and the 2019 Climate Variability and Conflict in the Central American Dry Corridor workshop. I organized the Fall 2020 ISI Speaker Series on the Politics of Water in Latin America. I have served on the LAII executive committee, the ISI executive committee and the LAII grants and awards committee. I have also served as section chair for the MPSA conference in 2018 and 2021.
